Moore High School Art Students Participate in Plaza Towers Elementary Memorial Debra Detamore


On May 20th, 8 Moore High School students created colored chalk designs in front of Central Jr. High School. The students based their designs on the names of the 7 students who perished in the tornado at Plaza Towers a year ago. Amy Simpson, the principal at Plaza Towers Elementary, had asked us to help with the Memorial Ceremony that would be held for the school on May 20th. Plaza Towers students have been attending school for the past year in classrooms at Central Jr. High, and the ceremony was held in the auditorium there. We did the name designs in colored chalk.



We were honored to help with this memorial. The Moore High School students learned that their art had power to communicate with a larger community than just their own school. Many teachers, administrators and parents came by during the creation and told us how much they appreciated what we were doing. An aunt of one of the students whose name was on the sidewalk told us she loved what the student had done, and that it "was perfect." She hugged the art stu-

dent who did the design, and cried as she expressed her appreciation.

The entire experience was amazing and humbling, and we were just glad we could help. The event was covered by local and national media.

They began at **The Amon Carter Museum of Amer**ican Art in Fort Worth where they viewed the special exhibit Art and Appetite: American Painting, Culture, and Cuisine._Norman Rockwell's painting Freedom from Want, also know as The Thanksgiving Picture, and Night Hawks by Edward Hopper were two of the most well known pictures on view. The next stop was the **<u>Kimbell Art Museum</u>** to see the permanent collection which includes the only painting by Michelangelo on exhibit in the Americas. The group walked across the street to **The Modern** to visit the outdoor sculptures Vortex by Richard Serra and Hina by Deborah Butter-Left to right: Dylan Brown, Jeanna Stillman, Morgan field. The highlight of the trip was Late Nights at the Dallas Museum Hayes, Alexis Armendariz, and Samantha Dillman enjoying the Vortex, a 67'x 21' x 20' Cor-ten steel statue of Art. The museum is open from 6:00 pm until midnight the 3rd Friday which is also an echo chamber of each month. The current exhibition is Nur: Light in Art and Science from the Islamic World. Throughout the night, guests were invited to enjoy music, talks, films, tours and family activities inspired by Islamic art and culture. Some of the experiences were a dabke dance performance by Firget Bladi, a calligraphy demonstration, an opportunity to create light graffiti, and a performance by Islamic Nasheed artists Fez Meghani and Aftab Ali, and more! Four museums in one day, great art, and late night art experiences, who could ask for a better trip!


