History of OAEA

The Oklahoma Art Education Association was initiated in 1960. Art Educators from around the state joined together establishing a Constitution and Bylaws governed by an elected group of executive board members and appointed officers. Each board member is a volunteer serving a two year term for the association in promoting OAEA vision and goals with fundraising and public education strategies.



Goals

Learning: OAEA will sponsor and provide ongoing professional development to meet the needs of all art educators through statewide conferences, regional mini-conferences, advocacy initiatives, and publications.

Community: OAEA will build a more cohesive professional community among art educators, museum personnel, school administrators, and arts organizations.

Advocacy: OAEA will effectively communicate the importance of student and life-long learning in the visual arts to art educators, policy makers, parents, and the community.

Research and Knowledge: OAEA will increase its value to members by assessing programs and services that inform practice, and by expanding the access to information on current research and emerging policy issues that affect art education.

Statewide Events

Youth Art Month: (YAM) A collaborative sponsored coordination with the Council for Art Education, Art & Creative Materials Institute, Inc. and National Art Education Association of national exhibition, promotion, observance, and celebration with proclamation and endorsement among supporters for Oklahoma Youth Art Month art awareness in March.

Young Talent in Oklahoma: YTIO is a high school juried exhibition offering student scholarships, awards, and school program recognition.

Jr. Young Talent in Oklahoma: A junior/middle school juried exhibition offering students awards and school art program recognition.

Young People's Art Exhibit: YPAE offering K-12 students awards and school art program recognition.

Portfolio Day: A coordinated conversation among high school students and Universities and Art Schools for potential continuing education in visual arts areas.

Superintendent Capitol Showcase: A collaboration sponsorship exhibition in recognition and promotion of public school elementary visual art programs.
