





Portfolio Day

A quote from Marsha Carman, Art Instructor at Southwest Oklahoma State University in Weatherford about Portfolio Day 2019: "I always enjoy running into SWOSU grad and good friend, Bryon Chambers at Portfolio Day. I had a good time representing SWOSU and meeting so many art students. Thanks Oklahoma Art Education Association and Oklahoma City Museum of Art for hosting this statewide event. And a big shoutout to those dedicated art teachers who brought their students. Such a great opportunity to discuss their art and their future. And a special thanks to Jann Jeffrey and Jacquelyn Knapp for their hard work in making it happen." (Marsha is also a previous OAEA President who taught at Weatherford HS.)

Juniors and seniors were able to quiz the reps about what each art department had to offer for further study. They were given information on art and design courses, cost of tuition, degree information, facilities in the art department and what the general campus offered for freshmen. Also, the high school artists were able to hear another voice discuss their artwork. Some were given some pointers and suggestions. Others were asked questions about their specific pieces and it became a time of self discovery. Supporting a day when high school students could talk with art reps goes back to the 1980's but now it has tripled in size and no longer wanders from one location to another. The best of all possibilities was found when the OCMOA moved to the spectacular building downtown and they offered their support in this event. The museum allows Portfolio Day to use facilities free of charge and allows all participants to end the day with a tour of the current exhibits. Through a grant, they also pay for the cost of busses and drivers for high schools sending students.

Planning for this day starts as the current one concludes. Researching the location of higher ed art departments is never-ending and locating all the reps is on-going. Contacting the state's art teachers so that they are aware of this opportunity for their own art students is immense. While starting with the list provided through the membership of OAEA, this event is not held just for members. Therefore, the search starts as soon as fall classes begin. Information is distributed at the annual fall conference of the OAEA. Information is on the website of the organization as well. Registration begins to come in during September so that a specific time can be placed on the teacher's calendar.

Bryon Chambers, of the OCMOA is an essential clog in the smooth running of a day that could turn chaotic very easily. He can see ahead to solutions like an extra table or a missing student. Jann Jeffrey has been the Portfolio Day Chair for OAEA and handles the registrations of students, invitations to reps and details having to do with keeping things moving. Jacquelyn Knapp will also be working on this important event. Look forward to this event next year which usually takes place in January (3rd Friday.)


Young Talent in Oklahoma was once again hosted by Oklahoma Christian University. Judges viewed approximately 900 works of art. We had 799 general entries and 62 portfolios submitted. Junior Young Talent in Oklahoma, the statewide juried art exhibit sponsored by OAEA was held March 2 through April 6 at the Prairie Arts Center in Stillwater, OK. Prairie Arts Center is a collaborative project of the City of Stillwater and Oklahoma State University. A closing reception and award presentation was held April 6 with an excellent attendance of artists and their families.

The exhibit was jurored by Jena G. Kodesh, instructor of 2-dimensional art and art appreciation classes for Northern Oklahoma College on the Tonkawa and Stillwater campuses. Kodesh is a graduate of the Oklahoma Leadership Arts Program and a recipient of the Governor's Arts in Education Award and an honoree of the Journal Record 50 Making a Difference and was a 2018 candidate for Oklahoma Woman of the Year.

There were 269 pieces of middle-level artwork entered from across Oklahoma from twelve public and private schools. A total of 126 works of art were selected for the exhibit. YOUTH ART MONTH 2019

Youth Art Month had an extremely successful year as far as turn in and turn out! The young People's Art exhibit had 212 entries from 38 schools. The awards ceremony filled the entrance hall of Oklahoma City Community College Performing Arts Center and there were over two dozen teachers on hand to present awards. The State Superintendents Art Show Awards Ceremony filled the State School Board meeting room at the State Department of Education to maximum capacity and Elizabeth Maughan delivered a stirring speech about the many advantages and rewards of art in education to the crowd. The YAM committee gave out awards and everyone ate, drank, and enjoyed a wonderful closing awards ceremony.

March 8th, 2019 at the State Capitol was OAEA's Youth Arts Day. The event kicked off at 10:00 AM with a variety of speakers, performances, and acts from across the state. Elgin Jazz Band awed and amazed the crowd with their jazzy performances and snazzy tail coated costumes. The splendor of Putnam City's Silver Strings Orchestra brought several in attendance to tears. There were vocal and dramatic performances, including a comical operetta by Southmoore High School students. Oakridge Elementary in Moore saw a 6th grade dancer perform a lyrical dance that was simply stunning in its complexity and beauty. Oakridge students also created artworks for display in the rotunda. Native American Youth Dancers from several tribes performed an amazing set of dances with drums and songs, the impact of which stopped the Capitol in its tracks as the drumbeats and voices reverberated throughout the building.

Putnam City's drama department saw an amazing pair of students emcee the entire event. Tauri Sims of Norman High presented the flag design winner with the Youth Art Month flag and a Putnam City student presented a work of art to Dr. Koss. Speakers also included Senator Julia Kirt, Congresswomen and former fine arts teachers Toni Hasenbeck and Trish Ranson, Oklahoma State Department of Education's Dr. Cindy Koss, and Elizabeth Maughan. After the main event, students distributed artworks created by art departments from all over the state to the senate, congress, and their assistants for display on their doors and desks. 
